Trio de Janeiro to open 2019 chamber concert season

"A Viennese Afternoon With the Trio de Janeiro" is on the calendar to open the 28th Annual Bradford House Chamber Concert Series at 3 p.m. Sunday, Jan. 20. The concert is the first of four free programs in the 2019 season. Doors for all concerts will open at 2:30 p.m. 1979

The program includes the Beethoven Trio in B-flat Major, Op.11, and Schubert's Trio in B-flat Major, D898.

The piano trio consists of Haroutune Bedelian, violin; Lorna Griffitt, piano, and Armen Ksajikian, cello. Bedelian and Griffin are on the faculty at the University of California, Irvine, and Ksajikian is assistant principal cellist with the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra.

A flute-harp duo will perform music from around the world at 3 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 3. Flutist Cynthia Ellis and Harpist Cristina Montes-Mateo will play music from Italy, Russia, France and a solo harp piece, Winter Spirits by Katherine Hoover, inspired by Native American music. Duets will be sonatas by Nino Rota and Adrian Schaposhnikov and Camille Saint-Saens' "Fantasie, Op. 124.

Ellis has been solo piccoloist with Pacific Symphony since 1979, has served as principal flute for Opera Pacific and performs with orchestras throughout Southern California. She currently teaches applied music at Saddleback College and Vanguard University.

Montes-Mateo is solo harpist at the Orquestra de la Comunitat Valenciana in Spain and has been principal harp with the Munich Philharmonic and Royal Liverpool Philharmonic orchestras and gives master classes throughout the U.S. and Europe. She currently lives in Los Angeles, her base for solo concerts and recording sessions. Other concerts in the Bradford House Chamber Concert season are the Santiago String Quartet on March 3 and Con Fuoco!, a string quartet, on Saturday, April 6.
