Homes with History Second Story Due May 1

The new speakers series, *Homes with History*, offered by the Placentia Founders Society opened in February on Super Bowl Sunday.

Despite this scheduling conflict, two dozen people assembled to hear presentations on the Key Ranch by OC Parks Curator Brad Flynt and on the John Tuffree home by current owners Matt and Janna Wade.

On Sunday, May I Harriet Bouldin, Development/ Membership/Volunteer Manager at the Fullerton Arboretum, will add a second story to the series with a brief history of three historical homes located on the

CSUF campus. The presentation is free and open to the public.

The Heritage House is a unique feature on the arboretum grounds. Originally built in 1895 in downtown Fullerton, it was the home of the city's first resident physician, George C. Clark. It was moved to its present location in 1972.

The home of dairyman Henry Hetebrink, still in its original location, is now the Titan Athletic House. What is now the Golleher Alumni House had a sad beginning but eventually was acquired by the university from the Mahr family.

The February presentation was an informative look at the different challenges to restoration faced by a publicly accessed building and a private residence. The next discussion will focus on adaptive uses for preserved older structures.

The talk at the Bradford House begins at 3 p.m. on Sunday, May 1. Come early, seating is limited. \star

Currently the table is set with a more modern china, dating only from the World War II period. Shared by Judie Dee, it is Wedgewood of Eruria and



Barlaston. The light blue of the applied design was the only color available during the wartime period.



Seasonal themes have been presented in the past using the china on hand that was contemporary with the Bradfords' own dishes. Changes were made every few months so there was always something new to see.

Other new items one can spot include the tobacco tin that holds "A Cargo of Contentment in the Bowl of any Pipe" as well

as flavoring and spices for the kitchen.
