Secretary Stephanie Dolan said, "Tina was the person who brought people together. No matter what walk of life you came from, what industry you worked in or interests you identified with, Tina had a gift for finding common ground amongst diverse people and building upon that."

Curator Beth Woodard hung black wreaths on the external doors of the house in Tina's memory. This was to recreate the Victorian custom practiced when Bradford House was built. For the Annual Meeting in June, Beth and John Walcek developed a digital photo collage of Tina's many activities with the Society and shared it with members who attended.

Tina became involved with PFS in 2000 at the invitation of Alice Husovsky to assist in presenting the Haunted House. Eight years later she joined the board as the social media consultant, then treasurer, next VP of activities and finally president.

Stephanie added, "In many ways Tina was a visionary. She was always able to envision future projects, implement plans, and facilitate ideas. Nothing was too far out of her reach." Tina was fifty-three years old. **#**

The museum was founded by members of the Moulton family and focuses on their pioneering ranching efforts begun by Lewis Moulton who came to California in 1874. The current exhibit, *1874: Into the West*, details his immigration, ranch formation, and struggles.

It was a pleasure to learn about the founding of a new museum, established in 2022, about the Moulton family's development through its current exhibition, and about its upcoming exhibit, *Women on the Ranch*, scheduled to open in September 2024

On Wednesday afternoons in July and August, critical behind-the-scenes work was carried out at Bradford House. Under the direction of curator Beth Woodard, the museum holdings were verified against a master list, missing and damaged items were noted, textiles were refolded to reduce stress, and newly acquired artifacts were added to the log. Though presently listed, there were several forgotten treasures brought to light during the process. Plans to share them in some way with the public are being considered. **#**



The Placentia Founders Society formed in 1974 to preserve and maintain the **Bradford House**, which was built in 1902. Now it is a living museum, providing a glimpse into the lives of a pioneering family who made their fortune in the citrus industry.
